Dear Brothers and Sisters,

"But he answered one of them, 'I am not being unfair to you, friend. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius? Take your pay and go. I want to give the one who was hired last the same as I gave you. Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?' "So the last will be first, and the first will be last." Matt 20:13-16 (NIV)

The Parable of the workers in the vineyard is an interesting parable, with its revolutionary tones and a little controversial works of arguing with the landowners, payments for a day's work, and last will be first conclusion. Jesus often uses parables to teach, but we need to look back at Matthew 11 where the disciples came up and asked, "Why do you tell stories?" He replied, "You've been given insight into God's kingdom. You know how it works. Not everybody has this gift, this insight; it hasn't been given to them". We in the MCF also ask, or have been asked the same question, and it is no different for us as it was for the apostles. Be like the landowner, go out and find those who are not doing anything for their payment, and help them get this gift from Christ.

May we the members of MCF be filled with praise for Christ, and with the Holy Spirit's help bring others into fellowship and worship for our living Christ.

I also encourage you all to think and pray about the upcoming AGM and Defence Christian's dinners as we strive to support, assist and encourage our Defence Chaplains, our local communities, and the wider church universal (within Defence and our local parishes).

FCMM, and Rare Bible viewing by David Coleman (MCF-A Sec)

The annual meeting of the FCMM leads was held in Solid Rock Ministry's (SRM) headquarters in Weston, ACT on Thu 7 Sep. David Coleman (Secretary) and Julie Jaensch (Staff Worker) were in attendance representing MCF-A. Representatives shared how God has been working through their respective ministries over the past 12 months and where they intend to direct their efforts for the future. The group then committed each of the ministries to God in prayer.

The meeting worked through a series of discussion questions about what the FCMM is and how this cooperative forum can best serve us all into the future. The FCMM is not an umbrella organisation, rather a cooperative arrangement in which the partner organisations commit to pray for and support each other in a spirit of cooperation for the role that each plays in God's kingdom work in Defence. It enables us to share initiatives, keep abreast of what each other are doing and coordinate efforts where that may provide efficiencies or amplification of effort. The meeting also discussed refreshing the FCMM covenant that was last signed in August 2016.

Chris and Tina, representing Bible Society Australia (BSA) were also in attendance for much of the meeting. While not strictly members of the FCMM, the level of support and funding for specific initiatives the BSA provides continues to be a source of great encouragement to all of the partner members and BSA reiterated their desire to continue to support Christian military ministries.

The BSA arranged a rare Bible viewing at St Marks Theological College in Barton the following morning, to which all participants were invited to attend. This was a great opportunity to see some very old copies of the Bible, some hundreds of years old and very well worn, including a number that have seen notable military service. Participants were treated to a very informative presentation by a member of the College, <u>Dr John W Harris</u>, who provided the history and context of each of the rare Bibles on display. The staff at St Marks expressed their willingness to host another similar event in future if there is sufficient interest.
