

AMCF World Conference: Brazil 13 - 19 Oct, 2024

Since then the concept of indigenously-organised ⁽¹⁾ military Christian fellowships (MCFs) has spread from nation to nation as military Christians became excited about the impact military Christians can have in their nations. Additionally, AMCF's three supporting organisations -- <u>ACCTS</u>, <u>MMI</u>, and <u>MSO</u> -- have played a large role in the growth and development of military Christian fellowships worldwide.' 2024 will be the 14th **AMCF World Conference** which will be hosted by UMCEB (Brazilian MCF), the South American VP, ACCTS and AMCF and will take place in the town of Aguas De Lindoia, nr Sao Pãulo in Brazil.

There is space for 2,000 participants to attend, each at a cost of US\$600 which will include transport from the airport (Sao P $\tilde{\alpha}$ ulo -Guarulhos International Airport code: GRU), all food and accommodation. That will not include the costs of flights/travel to Brazil. The conference will take place in the Majestic Hotel Conference Centre. (Hotel Majestic).

The objective of the conference is to invigorate those MCFs already in existence and to inspire participants from countries without an MCF to create one. This objective will be met by 'Empowering spiritual encouragement and leadership'. Leadership is an integral aspect of the military Christian's life and ministry, and the AMCF World Conference will nurture leadership skills in both current and future international MCF leaders.



Movie for your Small Group/family outing




In cinemas from 30 November


Being the Good Bad guys

Is it getting harder to live out your Christian faith in the workplace?

Since this question was raised at our Exec meeting in July, I have read a short book provided by Julie, entitled *Being* the *Good Bad Guys* which provides some helpful insights into this question and the broader challenge of living the Christian life in the modern western world.

The author, Stephen McAlpine, perceptively notes that Christians have largely failed to notice the shift in cultural thinking is not from a nominally 'Christian' era into a pluralist society in which all belief systems compete from an equal footing. Instead, we have discovered our modern western culture is not truly pluralist at all and the Christian worldview and its morality is not viewed as an alternative amongst equals, but as undesirable and even harmful. Hence we are not imagining when we witness our culture's increasing tolerance for almost any view so long as it is not Christian.



We are moving into a post-Christian era. Coming from a culture in which the Christian view was a largely respected position in society and therefore Christians and their institutions have historically enjoyed significant power and influence, into a position where we are the under-dog. Because of this, and the public perception we still enjoy undue influence, McAlpine warns against developing a persecution complex.

Navigating this transition is painful, but McAlpine reminds modern day Christians in the western world that we are no worse off than most Christians across cultures and through history. We are moving out of a time and culture in which Christianity has been uncharacteristically accepted, into one that is more reflective of the status quo across time and culture. It is challenging for us, in part because we are not used to it.

McAlpine warns against the expectation of any immediate national or global apocalyptic implosion as the world 'goes to hell in a handbasket' to prove us right. This is unlikely to take place. But he notes that this new breed of pluralism represents a house divided against itself and therefore will certainly fail to deliver on its promised utopia. The opportunity for faithful Christians will increasingly exist to pick up the pieces of lives shattered through faith in false ideologies and provide them with *true* hope. He forecasts some challenging times ahead, but as Christ also did, encourages us not to worry or despair. Christianity and the church will never die nor become irrelevant and there is still very much a viable and fruitful ministry for Christians.
