

# **Defeating the Unseen Enemy**



In the film Lord of the Rings when Frodo Baggins places the ring on his finger the screen turns to black and white and he becomes terrified as he sees the parallel world of spiritual darkness. This is symbolic of the reality of the unseen spiritual world in which we live today.

When a person is born again, God takes the veil away from their eyes enabling them to discern the spiritual realm. Unless we are aware that there is an unseen spiritual world the enemy can defeat us whilst we are totally focused on operating in the physical realm. Some of us have come face-to-face with the physical enemy on the modern battlefield of today but all of us are situated on the spiritual battlefield whether we are aware of it or not.

Not everyone is aware of the fact that the battleground is in our mind. The enemy's aim is to dominate our thinking with lies and deceptive thoughts that destroy our hope and our destiny. He continually whispers lies and deceptions in our ears, heart and mind.

Whilst a unit commander in the ADF-Army I had a "Damascus Road" experience accepting Jesus as my Lord and Saviour, being born again dramatically in the twinkling of an eye following crying out to God for help when I was facing a grievous health issue.

Following my salvation and immediate miraculous healing, praise Jesus! - my beloved soldiers in the unit were taken aback by the instant makeover of their Unit Commander.

As a member of the Military Christian Fellowship (MCF), I have forwarded a number of formal prayer requests to MCF HQ Canberra seeking "top prayer cover" for Brigade and Unit complex live firing training exercises. Copies were also sent to participating senior ranking officers and SNCOs and I was blessed in one instant by one of my non-Christian Field Ranking Officers rating the outcome of the prayer request as one hundred percent effective.

In recent times the Holy Spirit has led me to train emerging "spiritual commandos" in the lethality of applying the natural Principles of War to the Spiritual domain as a way in which we can take the 'high ground" in defeating the unseen enemy.

Some examples of the application of spiritual lethality as Tactics, Techniques and Procedures (TTPs) -

- **# Supernatural Spiritual "Fires"** Ammunition for our 155mm M777 Howitzers can be symbolic of the word and promises of God. Loading ammunition into the breach is symbolic of meditating on the word of God. Speaking aloud God's promises is akin to firing an "artillery barrage" in the spiritual domain without range restrictions,
- # Authorised Precision Strikes Acting with God's spiritual authority targeting "high value targets" in the spiritual battlefield is analogous to an authorised JTACs (Joint Terminal Attack Controller / Artillery Observer) calling in battlefield fire support from close air support (CAIRS), ground and naval firepower assets as an authorised observer.

The attached article entitled "Defeating the Unseen Enemy" published in the MCF Crossfire Magazine Number 17 in May 2016 outlines in more detail additional spiritual TTPs that can be employed to maintain our offensive posture.

## The Sallyman celebrates 125yrs of service to the ADF



Since the second Boer war, The Salvation Army has supported serving men and women in times of peace and in conflict. Whether it is field training, in barracks preparing or deployed overseas, The Salvation Army has worked alongside and faithfully ministered to bring comfort, counsel and sustenance. Members of the ADF and the Forum of Christian Military Ministries (FCMM), including the Council of MCF-A, were invited to celebrate 125 years of Red Shield Defence Services (RSDS) with an evening at the Australian War Memorial.

The evening commenced with the Last Post Ceremony in which the story of <u>William Bramwell 'Bill' Tibbs (1909-1943)</u> was read. Bill Tibbs is the only Salvation Army Red Shield Representative who was lost during conflict and members of his family were present.

The ceremony was followed by a group photo by the pool of reflection and then a lovely dinner with representatives of RSDS and its supporting partners in the Aircraft Hall. During the dinner The Salvation Army band played, including a new score written for the anniverasay, and they launched a new book on the history of RSDS, "Still serving" by Lindsay Cox, covering the work of The Salvation Army from the Boer War and into the first world war. The book is available through SalvosOnline.

It is a great testimony to God's grace that what started as a brave but simple act of mercy by faithful servants of God 125 years ago has flourished and continues to support and encourage our serving men and women today. This should spur each of us on in our respective Christian service since we may never know what legacy we leave through even our smallest acts of faithful Christian service.
