As humans we all experience distressing or deeply disturbing experiences as we journey through life, I have had my fair share over the years. Despite the inference on the daily news feeds traumatic experiences are not something new. Some years ago, I wrote a poem speaking of this, it is produced below.

The fall of Fear (2018)

Fear, that tyranny, from the bowels of hell, Exacerbated by the tolling worrisome bell. Fear, the soulmate of despondent anxiety, The worry of all things with no proprietary.

Fear, that brings cavernous darkness into one's heart. Striving to snuff out the Hope spark, Of life, love and all things spiritual, Fear that focusses one's mind on things temporal.

The castle giant of despair and doom, With club and chains and dungeons of gloom. Binds the spirit and strives to restrain the soul, Wrestling it towards the deep black hole.

But wait, a thin ray of light, Rapier like pierces the darkness and deep night. Hope glimmers weak then stronger still, The shadow of the Cross looms from across the crucifixion hill. A visit to Timor Leste - By LTCOL Jamie van Heel

Jamie van Heel, AMCF VP of the Pacific visited Timor Leste between 16-22 June to meet with and encourage the Timor Leste Military Christian Fellowship. Two delegates from Timor Leste, Chaplain Rui Gomes and LT Tome Soares attended the AMCF World Conference in Sao Paulo Brazil in October 2024. They were escorted by LTCOL Eric Bettanin who is currently posted to Timor Leste as part of the Defence Cooperation Program. Eric generously offered for me to let me stay with him and his family in Dili, which was much appreciated.

The purpose of my visit was to meet up with the two Timor Leste delegates who attended the AMCF World Conference, as well as, LTCOL Salus De Vasconcelos (left in first picture below), and Captain Christian Dias (Police), of the Timor Leste MCF (right in first picture below) and others. My role in the Pacific is to encourage and mentor the leadership and members of MCFs in the Pacific Region to enable them to grow their MCF. On arrival on Mon 16 June I was picked up at the airport by Timor Leste members and taken to a local café where we were able to introduce ourselves. Cristian then took me to the Christos statue where there are great views back to Dili. On the Tues evening I was hosted by the Timor Leste MCF at a restaurant in Dili where further conversations took place about challenges and opportunities of the Timor Leste MCF. On Wed 17 June Eric and I were taken to a Police Unit where we met three of their mascots (crocodiles) and were able to feed them (a definite highlight). Another important connection was made here where Tetum Bibles were offered to the Police Company Commander who then was provided with 100 Bibles on the Friday to distribute to his company. Cristian is also looking to distribute these Bible to new Police recruits. On the Friday I met with Chaplain Rui Gomes at the F-FDTL Headquarters and socialised an opportunity to have a Timor Leste military camouflage Bible produced in Tetum language with the Commanders foreward and suitable Timor Leste military photos.

On the Saturday there were two locations for a Timor Leste MCF Conference held at a rural church 40 minutes outside of Dili, and then an evening service in Dili itself. Both services had local worship bands and I was able to provide them with a presentation on AMCF and how they could grow spiritually. At the conclusion of the presentations I was presented with a Timor Leste scarf that was particular to that region. I was also able to provide gifts to the pastors and Timor Leste leadership that MCF-A generously provided to me.

I am planning to visit Tonga toward the end of September with the new Association of Christian Conferences, Teaching and Service (ACCTS) Executive Director Terry Wichert while he is visiting the Pacific. I also plan to visit Fiji in 2026 to encourage their MCF leadership teams. Jamie

A reflection by Dr Daniel Solomon - his perspective of an answer to prayer

I prayed several times, over many years, that one day I would get married. God told me to keep serving in my Church and He would send the right person to Church. In the meantime, I developed a list of qualities that I desired for my wife, based on 3 key aspects, which I think are very important for all of us. First and foremost is Godliness, since our spouse must be a Christian (2 Corinthians 6:14). If they are not a Christian, then we should not consider them. The second aspect was attractiveness, which is clearly important in marriage. The third aspect was compatibility, which is also important for a successful marriage. Based on these 3 key aspects, I developed an extremely ambitious list of 30 qualities!! These qualities included being a Christian, attends Church, very knowledgeable about the Word of God, full on for God, pretty, kind, caring, cooks nice food and a professional. Clearly, the likelihood of someone meeting all 30 qualities is extraordinarily low. I however prayed to God that He will give me a lady with all the 30 qualities.

In 2016, I first noticed this special person walk into the Church I attend, but it was in 2017 that God showed me that she was the one for me. From late 2016, she attended the home group that I jointly led, so I realised that she met many of the qualities I desired. Hence, I asked her out. She however mentioned that God had not told her that I was to be her husband! I hence continued to pray, fasting and praying on many occasions, and God was acting in the background. A few of her close Christian friends told her that she should consider me, and in 2024 God showed her that I was the one for her. We then got married in her hometown. I then realised she met all 30 qualities, plus she also met some other qualities which I desired but had not written down e.g. someone who would draw me even closer to God. God can truly give us our righteous desires (Psalms 37:4), if we delight in Him, earnestly seek Him and be guided by Him.
