Remembrance and Sacrifice by Chaplain Chris

Chaplain Walter Ernest Dexter MC DSO DCM was a volunteer trooper, Anglican minister, and later an enlisted chaplain in the AIF. Having experienced conflict during the South African War (1900–1901), he enlisted in the AIF on 8 September 1914 as a chaplain with the 5th Battalion (later 2nd Brigade, then 1st Division). A colourful character, Dexter loved being among soldiers—remaining close and positioned to serve however he could.

After landing on the Gallipoli peninsula on 17 May 1915, he stayed in the thick of the action—often downplaying the cost of such service. On the sixth occasion he was wounded, he wrote:

"I got a shrapnel bullet on my left elbow. I sat... to get over the pain and then went to my own camp and dressed it there. I don't want my name to go down as wounded."

Dexter's deep love for serving soldiers led him to write later:

"How can I go back to parish work after all this amongst men?"

He felt called by God to be a warm, enthusiastic, and constant presence for those in deep pain and anguish as they faced death daily. In such moments, Simon Peter's response to Jesus in John's Gospel likely resonated deeply with him:

"'Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life, and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God.'" (John 6:68–69)

Knowing Jesus as the Holy One of God—the only real hope he could offer—Dexter bore the weight of sacrificial service by simply being present with the men. It was Christ's redemptive message that inspired Dexter to live with an embodied hope. He never promised an end to war after the next ceasefire or volley—but he could promise that the Lord was with them in the danger.

As David Gibson reminds us in The Lord of Psalm 23, referencing Psalm 23:4:

"The comfort is the presence of the shepherd in the midst of the danger, rather than the comfort of the removal of danger."

Dexter's sacrificial service continues to inspire ministry today - but not just for chaplains but also for the priesthood of all believers (1 Peter 2.4-9). His embodied hope challenges all of us not to remain in the comfort of the offices or homes but to go—regardless of season, weather, or terrain—and share the good news wherever we can. So whenever any of us are sent anywhere we go as this embodied hope and such hope might be found as unbelievers look to troopers, seamen, aviators, officers and ORs - all of us. His faithful presence reminds us not to give up meeting regularly. Our on-base Bible study averages five attendees weekly, with a wider group of 15–20. Running a simple 'Swedish method approach' the group continues to attract members and subsequent prayer groups and 'discover' groups remain on offer.

Rooted in the Word, we're driven to pray—for peace, repentance, trust, comfort, and with longing: "Come, Lord Jesus." What we encourage soldiers to do today hasn't changed—simple Christian disciplines. But these simple disciples remind us of a profound God and an amazing gospel, calling us to be "living sacrifices."

ACCTS Pacific visit - reflection by Jamie Van Heel



The Association for Christian Conferences, Teaching and Service (ACCTS)

Executive Director Terry Wichert (former Navy Captain submariner) made a visit to the Pacific from the USA and was hosted by Jamie van Heel (AMCF VP Pacific) from Wed 17 Sep until Tues 22 Sep 25.

On Wednesday afternoon Terry and Jamie met with LTCOL Phil McMaster to discuss exciting opportunities with the Pacific Defence Faith Network, reflecting on recent gatherings of the PDFN in Auckland and Canberra and next year's PDFN planned for Fiji. Terry was pleased that support is being provided for Christian Chaplaincy in the Pacific and was interested in how ACCTS may also be able to provide training to military chaplains in the Pacific.

On Thursday morning Jamie and Terry met with Russell and Helen Bielenberg (former ACCTS Pacific workers) and reminisced about times past and how God

has been working through ACCTS Ministry. Russell presented Terry with his book MCF Faithful Service that he wrote on the history of the Military Christian Fellowship of Australia.



On Thursday afternoon Terry and Jamie met with the Anglican Bishop to the Defence Force and Australian Navigators leader Grant Dibden, Thomas Bielenberg and Andrew Oldfield from the Navigators and James Leitch from Focus Military Ministries at ADFA for a conversation on what God is doing through their ministries at ADFA. Terry had been the military lead for the Navigators in the USA so the discussion was fruitful.

On Thursday evening Terry and I met with Eric and Lynda Burton (Eric was former AMCF VP of the

Pacific), David and Liz Coleman, Daren and Julie Jaensch and my wife Jo over dinner at the Ainslie Football club. This was a good opportunity for Terry to meet with MCF Australia members and for MCF Executive members to understand more about ACCTS Association for Christian Conferences, Teaching and Service (ACCTS)

On Fri afternoon Terry and Jamie flew to Brisbane to have dinner with Fijian chaplain Taniela Tama who had been posted to Brisbane with a Fijian company for six months. Taniela had attended the AMCF World Conference in Brazil so it was great for Terry and Jamie to catch up with and pray for Taniela with his soon return back to Fiji. Taniela advised that during Exercise Talisman Sabre he would conduct a Christian service each night with his Fijian company where they would worship God and he said that many military members from other countries would join them, attracted by the singing and hearing from the Word of God. Taniela advised that many international and Australian military members became Christians through these services (Praise God).

On Friday evening Terry and Jamie flew from Brisbane through Auckland to arrive in Tonga on Saturday afternoon. We were greeted at the airport by Warrant Officer Toni Langilangi and Reverend Ikani (both who had attended the AMCF World Conference in Brazil). Toni arranged for us to have a driver and a mini bus to transport us to our accommodation and for the various dinners and activities around the island. On the Saturday evening Reverend Ikani hosted us for dinner and we finished the evening with a Kava ceremony. He explained the cultural significance of such ceremonies and we talked and prayed together for a couple of hours. Sunday morning was a highlight where we attended Tony's Methodist Church service. In Tonga everyone attends Church on a Sunday and the shops are closed. On the Monday morning we met with His Majesty's Armed Forces MCF Members as well as the Deputy Chief of Defence Staff (DCDS) CAPT (N) Sione Ulakai, the President of our MCF. We were delighted to see 50 MCF Members waiting to formally welcome us at the Navy HQ. Terry and I had an opportunity to share with the MCF Members and we retired to the conference room with the DCSD to continue discussions. Toni very graciously provided Terry and I a tour of the Island on the Sunday and Monday afternoon. We were very spoilt by Toni and Reverend Ikani and encouraged with what God is doing through His Majesty's Armed Forces in Tonga.

I was grateful that Terry made the trip to the Pacific and we were able to spend some quality time together building our relationship and discussing opportunities to grow MCFs in the Pacific region.


